At the State meeting the Board of Managers approved endorsing the 250th celebration of the founding of the Navy-Marine Corps celebration. No funds have been requested at this time. I have appointed Compatriot VP Timothy Middlebrook Chairman. There will be updates and I will notify the membership when they are received.

Compatriot Raynor B. Duncombe attended the National Spring Leadership Trustee Meeting on September 25, 2021. The NSSAR also endorsed the 250th celebration of the founding of the Navy and Marine Corps.



History Corner

Plans are underway to celebrate an important occasion in American history. The year 2026 is the Sesquicentennial celebrating the 250th anniversary of our Declaration of Independence. It is also an appropriate time to honor and recognize the the 250th anniversary of our Navy and Marine Corps.

The following is excerpted from the Homecoming 250 Navy Marine Corps

Launching the Sesquicentennial

The 250th Birthdays of the Navy and Marine Corps.

As the United States prepares to celebrate the 250th anniversary – the Semiquintennial – of the Declaration of Independence in 2026, we should celebrate in 2025 the creation of the military services that enabled and defend our independence. Homecoming 250 Navy Marine Corps is a non-profit created by numerous individuals and organizations to host the main 250th celebrations of the Navy and the Marine Corps in their birthplace: Philadelphia and the Delaware River.

The 250th anniversary of the Navy's founding on October 13, 1775, will be celebrated in October 2025 by assembling for touring on both banks of the Delaware historical, replica, and active-duty ships representing every major war which the Navy has fought: the American Revolution, the War of 1812, the Civil War, the Spanish-American War, World War I, World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Cold War, and subsequent conflicts in the Middle East. This unprecedented and spectacular exhibition of Navy history will include ships from the age of sail to the most sophisticated Navy vessels of today, with ships sailing in to join the unique and historic USS Olympia and USS New Jersey, the most decorated Navy ship afloat.

The 250th anniversary of the Marine Corps' founding on November 10, 1775, will be celebrated in November 2025 by assembling on both banks of the Delaware ships with a special connection to the Marines, including amphibious and aircraft-carrying vessels. Most importantly, the Marines' 250th will be celebrated at the recreated Tun Tavern, the Philadelphia waterfront tavern that was the birthplace of the Marine Corps. Tun Tavern will be recreated for the celebrations, will be operated by a charity, and will serve as a gathering place for decades to come.

The Second Continental Congress passed a resolution creating the Continental Navy on October 13, 1775, officially establishing our Navy. With the end of the war, the Continental Navy was disbanded. Then with the Naval Act of 1794 President George Washington created a permanent U.S. Navy due to threats to American merchant shipping by Barbary pirates in the Mediterranean Sea.

The Second Continental Congress passed a resolution on 10 November 1775 in Philadelphia to raise two battalions of Marines, a service branch of infantry troops capable of fighting both at sea and on shore.
